

Subject	Description
English	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Review elements of the sentence, including complete and simple subjects and complete and simple predicates• Recognize errors in sentence structure in their own writing• Apply rules of sentence structure, syntax, and grammar when writing in all subject areas• Vary sentence length by using compound subjects, compound predicated, compound sentences and subordinate clause• Recognize parts of speech- nouns, verbs, adjective, adverbs, pronouns and prepositions• Use proper forms of verbs, adjectives, and pronouns• Regular writing assignments include short paragraphs, persuasive letters, newspaper articles, essays and stories
Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Read stories of various genres, including suspense, realistic fiction, fantasy and non fiction• Incorporate approximately 60 words per week into their vocabulary• Weekly quizzes and tests in which students must show that they know the correct spelling meaning and usage of the selected words• Respond in writing to questions about texts that are read• Engage in independent reading and submit regular book reports
Social studies	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Study American history from pre Colombian times until the years immediately following the civil war• Study the expansion and settlement of the United States• Understand the causes of the American revolution• Gain a higher understanding of the structure of the federal government• Understand the regional differences that led to the civil war
Mathematics	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Multiply by one-, two-, and three-digit numbers• Multiply by a multiple of 10 or 100• Find areas and perimeters of squares, rectangles, and triangles• Perform division with one- and two-digit divisors• Choose an appropriate customary and metric units of capacity, weight, and mass• Compare and order decimals from tenths to thousandths• Add, subtract, and multiply fractions and mixed numbers with same/different denominators
